We notified the U.S. Department of State that we reversed your certification of seriously delinquent tax debt

We previously notified the U.S. Department of State that you were certified as owing a seriously delinquent tax debt. We reversed that certification and notified the U.S. Department of State.

What you need to know

You don't need to respond to this notice. Because we notified the U.S. Department of State that the certification of your seriously delinquent tax debt has been reversed, the U.S. Department of State is no longer required to deny your application for a passport or passport renewal and cannot revoke your current passport because you owe tax.

- The U.S. Department of State may, however, deny your passport application or revoke your passport for reasons unrelated to your tax debt.

On December 4, 2015, as part of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, Congress enacted Section 7345 of the Internal Revenue Code, which requires the IRS to notify the U.S. Department of State of taxpayers certified as owing a seriously delinquent tax debt. The U.S. Department of State is generally prohibited from issuing or renewing the passport of a taxpayer that has been certified. The FAST Act also requires the IRS to notify the U.S. Department of State of the reversal of a certification of a seriously delinquent tax debt.
